He learned different ways of life that helped him through his journey. He loved rugby, he and others were chosen from various schools in Tonga to represent the under 16's Rugby Tournament in New Zealand, and the same things went for him when he was 18 years old.

He joined the Technology course in Electrical Engineering when it was first introduced. In 2018 his last years were one of the hardest for him when his dad passed away suddenly. But that didn't stop Elder Feiloaki from moving forward, he went on to complete his Level 1 in 2018. He was currently working as an electrical engineer and was furthering his studies by enrolling in Level 2 in Electrical Engineering at Fokololo Technology Institute of Tonga. He gained a lot of experience in the industry and was looking forward to earning his Level 3 certification soon. He hoped to use the knowledge he gained to help improve his current job performance and move up the ladder in the future.

Having great friends and an excellent Ward and Stake helped him to learn more about the gospel of Jesus Christ, and the restoration of the gospel. He knew that with hard work and dedication, he could achieve any goal he set for himself. He hoped to become an example of what can be achieved with the right attitude and focus. In 2021, he received his mission call to serve in the Tonga Mission, where he spent a year.
