She grew up in Southern California where she became an athlete, avid surfer, and Beach Boys fan. Elisa lived most of her adult life in Salt Lake City, Utah and was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Elisa graduated from Alta Loma High School in Rancho Cucamonga, CA in 1981. As a high school student, Elisa excelled in academics and lettered in multiple sports, including tennis, basketball, volleyball, and track & field. Elisa also had the privilege of working with students who were homebound due to health issues. These were some of her favorite teaching experiences because it allowed her to gain a deeper understanding for each student and their family as she influenced and guided them toward success.
