His laugh was recognizable from across the room and he was known for wearing a T-shirt and shorts, even in the freezing cold. He enjoyed playing the saxophone in his school's jazz band and was an expert with little kids. He was always the first to make them laugh. He was passionate, enjoyed making friends, teaching others, and, when asked what his favorite subject to study was, Elliot enthusiastically replied: "Star Wars". Elliot was a light. His comforting energy could be felt no matter what you needed, whether that be a laugh or a good cry.

Elliot departed from this life on April 4, 2022. His loss is felt by many, but his love and light are not dimmed. He is survived by his parents, Regan and Aaron Benson, his brother Noah (16), his sisters, Alba (11), and Millie (7), his grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins, who all love him dearly.
