Emmy graduated from Brigham Young University with a bachelor of arts degree in art. While there, she participated in many choirs and studied abroad in France. She later received a Master of Arts degree from Bowling Green State University and a teaching certification from Weber State University. She taught art classes at the public school, college, and community levels. Her beautiful paintings were displayed in exhibitions, sold, and gifted to family and friends.

She served in many callings in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints over the years. These included a mission in Paris, France, and various callings in Sunday School, Primary, and many choirs. Her most recent calling was the piano accompanist in Relief Society for which she diligently practiced and “always played so beautifully.”

Of all her many talents and accomplishments there is no doubt she would claim her three children as her greatest achievement (much to their humble dismay). She loved them fiercely. To them, she passed her very best gifts: talents in music, art, and teaching.
