Frank Alfred Rueckert, our beloved father, husband, grandfather, brother, and friend passed away quietly at home January 30, 2024, at the age of 83.

Frank was born April 7, 1940, in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Frank and Thelma Craven Rueckert, the oldest of four children. Frank was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
