She graduated from BYU with a degree in elementary education. She taught in Duchesne, where she met Bob and they were married May 29, 1940 in the Salt Lake Temple. Together they shared 75 years of love and devotion here on earth which will continue throughout eternity. Until she met Bob, she had never been out of the state of Utah. Together they travelled the world and visited numerous LDS temples. Marjorie started helping Bob with his State Farm office, which inspired her to attend LDS Business College and become a licensed agent.

As an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, she served in many auxiliary positions.
