Georgia Maxine Goris “Yia Yia” loving mother, grandmother, sister, and friend, passed away peacefully in her sleep on Tuesday, February 22, 2022. Georgia was born October 9, 1936, in Park City, Utah to George Sr (Georgios Papadoupoulos) and Nettie Street Pappas.

She attended Jordan High School and met her future husband, George William Goris Sr. at a Bingham High football game. They were married in the Salt Lake Court House and were eventually sealed in the Salt Lake Temple on April 27, 1970.
