Jerry Frisbey, 89, of Salt Lake City, died peacefully in his sleep on January 29, 2024, after a several month long battle with cancer that had sent it into remission. A graduate of South High School, Jerry then served in the U.S. Army and a mission for the LDS Church, before graduating from Brigham Young University with a degree in psychology with a minor in accounting economics.

Even in his final days, when asked how he was feeling, and although he could sometimes barely get the words out, he would say, "I feel like a million dollars." He loved people. Jerry would talk to anyone and everyone. He greatly enjoyed meeting new people and learning all about them. Everyone who knew Jerry, loved him. He will be greatly missed.

Jerry is survived by his wife, Nona Frisbey, his daughters Lisa Morley (Ron) and Ann Saltzman (Brandt), his son Zane Frisbey (Kadee), his step-sons Anthony Barnett and Sean Barnett, ten grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his former wife, Eileen Frisbey. Jerry was preceded in death by his daughter Denise Durenburger.
