Gladys grew up in South Dakota, then moved to Wendover, Utah in 1942. Gladys attended Elko High School where she graduated in 1953. Gladys and Gus raised Lori, Jeff, and Brenda in Magna, UT. In 1969 they moved to Fort Bragg, NC, where Gustavo Jr and Rebecca were born.
