If something new came up, she would simply figure it out and go to work on it. Everything she did was done to absolute perfection and it is still not clear how one person could do so many things so well.

As their children grew up and moved out, Gloria took to continuing her motherly intuition by spoiling her pets. She raised dogs, chickens, quail and even some pheasants. Each of her dogs were treated just like they were her children and she loved them as such.

In 2007 Gloria was diagnosed with breast cancer. Through this devastation, her strong will took over and she was able to initially conquer it. For many years she had to live with knowing someday it could return. Unfortunately, in 2016 she was diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer, which sadly is terminal. Once again, with her unbreakable strength and courage she was able to keep it at bay for longer than the expected time. She underwent countless treatments and appointments through her battle.
