



## Holly Butler Burke

Holly Butler Burke, age 55, was born on July 27th, 1968, in Murray, Utah, to parents Melvin Boyd Butler and Carol Robinson Butler. She peacefully passed away on Sunday morning, August 20th, 2023, at her home in Herriman, after a courageous battle with melanoma cancer that spanned nearly two years.

Holly's early years were spent in Taylorsville, where she embraced her role as the oldest of seven siblings. Her parents and family fondly bestowed upon her the nickname "Happy Holly," a moniker that perfectly captured her radiant presence. Known for lighting up any room she entered, Holly's infectious laughter brought joy to all who were fortunate to know her.

Deeply devoted to her faith, Holly was an active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Throughout her life, she served in various significant church callings, including Relief Society President, Young Women's President, counselor, secretary, Ward Chorister, and Organist. Holly's academic journey led her from the islands of Tonga to Brigham Young University-Hawaii, where she also worked at the Polynesian Cultural Center. Returning to Utah, she continued her education at Brigham Young University, Provo, graduating with an RN/BSN degree in 1989.

During her studies, she crossed paths with her eternal companion, Matthew John Burke. They were united in marriage on May 5th, 1989, in the serene Millcreek canyon and sealed for eternity one year later in the Salt Lake City Temple. Holly joined Matt, who was serving in the Marine Corps in California, where she thrived as an unwavering support for her husband and the Marine community during Operation Desert Storm. Holly led the squadron's military spouses' group in support of the Marines during Operation Desert Storm. She organized and shipped food, care packages, and even a Christmas tree, aiming to alleviate homesickness among her husband and fellow deployed Marines.

After Matt's honorable discharge in 1991, Holly pursued her nursing career while raising three cherished children—Taylor, Alex, and Brianna. Her dedication to both roles was remarkable. Holly's nurturing spirit extended beyond her immediate family, as her home became a haven for countless friends, cousins, and extended family members. Her warm hugs, delightful treats, and boundless love made her house a source of comfort and joy for all.

In recent years, Holly's greatest source of joy was becoming a grandmother. Holding her grandchildren, Jimmy (2) and RaeLynn (6 months), brought immeasurable happiness to her life. Adorned with the title "Bama," bestowed in honor of Matt's grandmother, Holly relished each precious moment, especially when Jimmy affectionately declared, "Love you BAMA."

Holly is survived by her devoted husband of 35 years, Matthew, her loving sons, Taylor, Alex, and Brandon, her daughters, Brianna and Andrea, her adored grandchildren Jimmy and RaeLynn, and soon-to-arrive grandson "Peanut." She is also survived by her father, Mel, mother, Carol, brothers Paul, Mark, Dave, and Russell, and sisters Melony and Jill.
