James Vaughn Ammon, 58 years old, passed away on November 20, 2021 in Bountiful, Utah. He was born February 10, 1963, in Torrance, California.

He was an avid baseball player, playing on teams from the time he was 8 years old. His favorite team was the Dodgers, and he saved money from his paper route to attend a game. His high school team took state his senior year.
