As a young child during World War 2, he was separated from his family for a time and lived in Sweden due to the difficult circumstances the war had created until his parents could reunite his family and bring them to the US. What Jan learned from this experience was an attitude of “It was just an adventure” and to be patient even when life is hard.

Jan attended Granite High School where he was on the swimming team and in the Civil Air Patrol. He served in the US Army at Fort Benning, Georgia. He earned the rank of Spec 4 and was also on the Army shooting team and he advanced to Artillery 4.2 Mortarman. He was stationed in Germany for a time and was later honorably discharged in 1962. Jan spoke with great pride of the time he served his country.

Jan attended Clatsop Technology School in Oregon and majored in Industrial Technology. Jan married a young lady, Marie, and adopted her son, Russell. Jan and Marie had three children together: Roald, Theresa, and Tangerine. He found joy in his young family. Jan had a deep love for all his children. He later married Donna Linn Cleveland and lived in Salt Lake City, Utah. They were sealed in the Oakland Temple in 1974. They had four children: Robert, Aaron, Tanya, and David.
