



## Janet Peterson Burton

*Feb. 12, 1934 ~ April 8, 2023*

Janet Burton, 89, beloved wife, mother, grandma, great-grandma, sister and friend passed away peacefully on April 8, 2023. She was born February 12, 1934 in Salt Lake City, UT to Wesley Nels Peterson & Ruby Eliza Olsen. She spent her childhood and adolescence in Salt Lake City. She attended Highland Park Elementary, Irving Junior High and South High School (graduated 1952). She attended the University of Utah and Brigham Young University.

Married to W. Wayne Burton in The Salt Lake Temple on June 9, 1955. They were “lined up” by a mutual friend. Jan worked as a secretary at the Utah State Adult Probation and Parole Department before and after marriage. Wayne was in the military and they were transferred to several areas in the Western U.S. before returning to Salt Lake City.

- 1966 when Wayne was deployed to Vietnam, she moved the family back to Salt Lake City. She began her career at Kennecott Copper

Corporation (now Rio Tinto) as an executive secretary until she retired.

Jan was a very faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, serving in several ward and stake callings in the Relief Society and Young Women’s organizations. She served several missions with Wayne at the LDS Family History Center, Welfare Square and Oquirrh Family History Center at the Utah State Prison.

She loved her family and when she became a Grandma she was always eager to spend time with them whenever she could. She jumped in without hesitation to care for them when her daughter-in-law died suddenly 30 years ago.

Jan was a fabulous cook and was well known for her Sunday Dinners when all the family was invited. She also enjoyed making homemade Cream Puffs/Eclairs and shared with family, friends and neighbors.
