Jan met Donald Grosnick Felix at a bowling alley where they bowled on different teams, and he became the love of her life .They were married in Salt Lake City on February 1, 1973, and later sealed in the Salt Lake Temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 22, 1974. They were lovingly devoted to each other and married for 40 years. Don passed away on April 22, 2013. She was anxious to reunite with her dear husband.
