



Jason Castleton Cleary

Suddenly, unexpectedly, and at a far too young age, Jason Castleton Cleary, 50, passed away at his Fort Worth, TX, home on the evening of December 12, 2020.

Jason was born July 3, 1970, in Salt Lake City to parents Michael James Cleary and Jane Castleton Cleary. He married Heidi Grimm of Absecon, NJ in 1998. Although they divorced after 20 years of marriage, they shared the joy of their two children, Jane Caitlin and Breneman Tevis. Jason shared his last years living with his girlfriend, Mardona Carlstrom-Metsch, in San Diego, CA prior to their relocation to Fort Worth, TX.

Jason persevered through many challenges in his young adult years, always emerging stronger. After several moves during high school, he graduated from Bishop Gorman High School (Las Vegas, NV) in 1988. He went on to serve two years in the US Army as a field artillery survey specialist. Upon return he enrolled at the University of Nevada Las Vegas, earning degrees in Accounting and Finance in 1994. He became a CPA and CMA in 1996 while working at Arthur Anderson & Co. In 1997, Jason served in the Advanced Business Development Group of the US Peace Corps, educating business students and entrepreneurs in Ukraine. After returning from Ukraine he went on to earn an MBA from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania in 2000. He worked professionally for more than 10 years before deciding to be a stay-at-home father when his children were young. He later returned to the workplace, building a successful career as a civil servant.

Jason built a strong foundation in both of his children through his constant love and support. He was especially proud of the young adults they have become.
