Jeannine was raised in a beautiful and loving home as the second of two daughters, eight years apart. She spoke often of the grace and congeniality of her parents and family. She is our beautiful peacemaker, and her example regularly inspired those around her to look for the good and become a little more charitable. She made those in her presence feel loved and important. Her meek and mild approach is Christlike and powerful in the lives of those who know her.
