Jerry "Bumpy" Law peacefully returned to his Heavenly Father on September 23, 2022 surrounded by his loving wife and daughters. Jerry was born on March 1, 1939, in Ogden, Utah to John A. Law and Sarah Isabelle Boyle. He was the youngest of four children. In his youth, he enjoyed playing baseball, fishing, and hunting with his family. Jerry graduated from Ogden High School in 1957 and quickly enrolled at Weber State University, where he attended for 1 year prior to serving a faithful 3 1/2 year mission in the South German Stuttgart area. Jerry grew to love the language, culture, and people of Germany. After returning from his mission, he enrolled at BYU until he received his draft notice for the United States Army. He honorably served for 4 years; among his many duties, he served in the military police and as a game warden. During one of his military leaves, while teaching a Sunday School class, he met a shy young girl (Linda), who would later become his eternal companion. In 1963, he returned to Weber State University and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting. He spent over 50 years working as an accountant for public and private companies.

On August 19, 1966, he married Linda R. Kihlstrom in the Salt Lake Temple. Jerry and Linda were blessed with 4 daughters. He always said, "they are my greatest accomplishments!" Jerry was an active and faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and served in many church callings. He loved visiting Disneyland with his kids and grandkids.
