Our beautiful and beloved wife, mother, and grandmother, Jo Ann Andersen Cummings passed away at home on October 31, 2021 surrounded by her adoring family.

Jo Ann traveled widely, from Europe to Israel to Hawaii. She especially loved visiting Paris, and Denmark, the beloved home of her ancestors.
