He has remained friends with many of his classmates from Dublin Elementary School and Hayward High. Before going to high school, he went on a trip with his grandparents to Spain -- a trip he would never forget and some of his fondest memories with his grandparents. He learned a lot about his family’s history on that trip. He was a lover of music and enjoyed sharing his vast knowledge and discoveries with those close to him.

He greatly loved his kids. He raised 3 crazy, caring, and sarcastic children, and he couldn’t have been more proud of them. His grandbabies were his world -- they’re also crazy and sarcastic little monsters. He has many nieces and nephews and great-nephews that he cherished and was loved by.
