John Eugene Moray was born on October 23, 1928 to Thomas Henry Moray and Ella Emma Ryser Moray. John passed away peacefully at LDS Hospital on December 16, 2021 at 3:10 am. John was very active in Scottish Festivals representing the Moray/Murray clan for many years. His love of his Scottish heritage has carried on to his children and grandchildren.
