Ivanna, a care manager with his insurance who was a living angel more times than we can count. John's many doctors, Michelle Palmer (primary), Dr. Adhish Agarwal, and other nephrologists on their team, the many cardiologists, and the U of U heart transplant team, Dr. Andrew Davis at Salt Lake Retina, and his brother-in-law, Dr. Jeff Mellor, for his extensive eye care. We are thankful for Bishop Briton Gardner and Bishop Jacob Frost of the Brookhaven ward (Porter Crossing Eagle Mountain Stake) and the Priest Quorum bringing John the sacrament each Sunday, the last years of his life.
