He ran and created restaurants around the US, and eventually created the BBQ sauce known as "Nasty Sauce," which was always on hand whenever John was around. In such high demand, it wasn't uncommon to find him stirring five-gallon buckets of the sauce to be delivered to his friends. Many would say he had some of the finest BBQ to be found. The world will miss the flavor of his cuisine as much as it'll miss the flavor of his unique character.

John Diamond was also a stalwart man of God, Country, and Family. With a strong love for God, John was an ardent defender of his faith, his moral convictions held proudly on his shirt sleeve. A patriot and a veteran, John spent time in the army as a mounted military police officer, and he remained a symbol to many of what it meant to be a strong man today.

He was often compared to the stars in Western movies, and was said to have the looks of Tom Selleck, the mannerisms of Clint Eastwood, and the stride of John Wayne—for those that knew him, all those would be wildly accurate. He was a big man with a big personality and a big heart, and sometimes, but not often, a big cowboy

mustache.
