Joyce B Harper, born July 8, 1929, to J Earl, and Stella Marie Bolton, passed away peacefully amongst family and friends on July 15, 2022, one week following her 93rd birthday.

Joyce married Ross Spence Harper in 1947. They celebrated 64 years together until Ross passed in 2011.

She was "the red-headed, spicy, screaming, professional fisherwoman" and she loved her reputation. Joyce had no problem telling you the "way it is" and we loved her for it.

They bought property in Manila and enjoyed fishing, building up their second home, entertaining family & friends, and enjoying life to its fullest.

Joyce's cooking was that of a culinary master chef. She was famous for making meals of any cuisine. She could do it all! Joyce and Ross also loved many cats through the years.

Joyce was a Utah Jazz fan, always loving to watch, talk the talk, and telling whoever listened what they needed to do to be better! She was thrilled to attend an occasional game in person.

In February 2020 Joyce was diagnosed with Dementia. In December, during winter snows and rampant Covid, Joyce agreed to "snowbird" in a warmer climate and flew to Phoenix, Arizona to visit Craig and Chris. She enjoyed walks, bird watching, golf ball hunting out by the course, planting potted flowers, and caring for them, and gourmet food daily. She played puzzles, watched Jeopardy, Family Feud, Bold and the Beautiful, golf, and lots of Jazz games. She enjoyed coffee and cocktails daily in a "safe loving environment." It had its challenges, but Dementia and times in Covid are not always fun. She was losing so much, her independence, control, dignity, and her mind. In early Summer, Joyce returned to Salt Lake and resided at The Ridge Cottonwood a senior living community in Holladay, Utah. In the beginning of her 13-month residency, she was confused and lost, but almost immediately stated. "If you need to be someplace like this...this is the place to be". She quickly adjusted and made it her home, enjoying many activities and friends!

It is with great sadness that we say goodbye to Joyce Harper, mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and friend. She will forever be remembered for the beautiful spirit she had! She truly lived for all her 93 years.
