He worked as a licensed electrical apprentice for DC Electric. He was a Jordan High Beet Digger through and through, and a 2020 graduate where he wrestled, played football, and made lifelong friends.

Kelly loved snowboarding, wakeboarding, football, basketball, golfing, and music. When Kelly would get ready for Friday night, he was down for anything, he would always go with the flow. Kelly was fearless and well-known for his big heart, contagious smile, and beautiful red hair. He lived everyday like it was his last. Kelly was our beautiful boy, a total stud, and the life of the party. Kelly lived his life to the fullest surrounded by his family and friends. He had friends from grade school that lasted a lifetime. Kelly was the most genuine person that made his friends feel like he was “their person”. Kelly was very close with his family, so close that he was his sister’s “bridesman” at her wedding, and he was best friends with his siblings and parents.

During his senior year, Kelly received the “Big Time Player” award from his football team (family). His friends and family loved watching Kelly play football since the day he started in little league. His sisters were his biggest fans. His talent was recognized early on by coaches and teammates.
