Thursday morning, May 11, 2017, we lost our father, grandfather, great grandfather, brother and friend, Gordon Egon Glaus. Finally, he was instrumental in the reopening of the Geneva Steel Mill, as the Director of Sales in Provo, Utah. Gordon loved being a part of many different investment groups. He was a financial wizard and loved to talk about the stock market with anyone that would listen. He prided himself on working hard to stay fit. His favorite activities were tennis, golf and walking the track at Olympus High School. He played golf in 40 different states but never had a hole-in-one. Gordon was a member of both the Salt Lake Swim and Tennis Club and Hidden Valley Country Club. He enjoyed his weekly breakfasts with his tennis group at Dee's.
