Her countless and wondrous works of art, endless and meticulous photo albums, beautiful letters and writings, live on as a testament to her loved ones of her vulnerability and joy. She used her art to heal herself and to heal others. She loved this quote from Brene Brown. "How do we move information from our head to our heart? How do we take what we know and make it a practice in our lives? The answer is - through our hands. Through Creativity." She believed our Creator knows how healing it is to create.
