He taught his daughters how to change a tire, check their oil, and many other necessary tasks. His hobbies included cars, competitive motocross racing, and motorcycle riding with his family. He always owned a dirt bike and even attempted the Widow Maker hill in Draper, Utah. He was skilled at working with wood and made many beautiful improvements in their home. Even when he was too weak to do the work himself, he loved to help his sons and sons-in-law with building advice which was always much appreciated. Camping with his family was his happy place.

He had a quick wit and a great sense of humor. He relished debating the younger generation on politics for hours on end, always somehow keeping the upper hand. He was a loving and kind man who was always willing to listen, give good advice, and lend a helping hand to anyone in need.
