Larry and Irene fell in love and were married in 1974. They bought a house and moved to what was then the small town of Centerville, Utah.

In Centerville, they grew their family as they had three children who Larry would love with all of his heart. Russell was born first and two years later Marshall was born. Three years after Marshall was born, they were blessed to have a baby girl, Erin.

Larry would spend countless hours with his children. Along with being their loving father, he was their friend, teacher, coach, and role model. Larry spent many hours volunteering in youth sports.
