Lee Clair Rasmussen was born on December 5, 1939, in Murray, Utah, to Carol Erickson and Alfred Clair Dee Rasmussen. He died peacefully at his home in Sandy, Utah, on February 5, 2024, after contending with pulmonary hypertension for many years. His wife and two of his children were with him as he passed from this earthly life.

He was raised in Murray, Utah, where he attended Arlington Elementary School and Murray Junior and Senior High Schools. He played the saxophone in the marching band and played every sport there was to play. He graduated from Utah State University with a master's degree in physical education.

Lee often joked that he had a hard time holding down a job very long as he had several careers. The first was teaching high school and coaching football. He then worked for the FBI as a special agent and was assigned to offices in San Diego, California; Dallas, Texas; Denton, Texas; Los Angeles, California; and back to Salt Lake City. While working for the FBI in Los Angeles, he attended Southwestern Law School obtaining his law degree. He retired from the FBI after 24 years of service and then opened his own law practice in Salt Lake City.

He was a very self-motivated person. He was always learning new things and taking up new hobbies from auto mechanics to wood turning to fly fishing, but his favorite pastime in his retired years was fishing with all his buddies. For 25 years he coached Little League football, having a positive influence on many young men.

Lee was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served in many callings, but his favorite was working with the youth. He worked in the Draper, Utah, Temple for ten years and often remarked that it was a wonderful experience.

He married his high school sweetheart, Marlene Black, on September 7, 1961, in the Salt Lake Temple. They were blessed with four beautiful children.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, his children LeeAnn (Farrell) Yeaman, Suzanne (Dennis) Buccola, Brad Lee (Alicia) Rasmussen, Kaydee Rasmussen, and 15 grandchildren. Stepsister, Marian (Gary) Jones, stepbrother, Roger (Sandy) Anderson; sisters-in-law, Phyllis (David) Sperry, Janet (Walt) Brooks; brothers-in-law, Brent Horton and Jerry (Debbie) Black.
