Amidst deep sorrow, we announce the passing of Dr. Lester Martin Partlow, Ph.D. Born in 1943 and distinguished in the sphere of Pharmacology and Toxicology. Dr. Partlow breathed his last breath on January 29, 2024. He was an esteemed alumnus of the Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, MD, where he acquired his Ph.D. in 1969. Dr. Partlow's career included being an Associate Professor of Pharmacology and Toxicology at the University of Utah. At retirement, Dr. Partlow was award Emeritus Status. He cared greatly for his students and advised many of them personally. He strove to maintain the highest standards of teaching, research, and administrative work. He served ten years on the Medical School Admissions Committee. He revised his lectures yearly and included jokes and pertinent examples to engage his students more fully. He maintained a research laboratory for many years and published several articles in premier journals. He was often invited to engage in the peer review process and filled this role conscientiously.
