Linda Burke Dalley, age 77, our beloved sister, aunt, and friend passed away September 16, 2022, at her home in Salt Lake City from heart and liver complications.

Linda was born May 16, 1945 in Idaho Falls, Idaho to Oscar and Lavetta Fugal Burke. She married Orien Austin Dalley February 4, 1972 and they were sealed a year later in the Salt Lake Temple. They divorced in May 1985.

She loved being a "farm girl" and found much joy in animals and nature, and especially working alongside her siblings on the farm. She was an avid reader, enjoyed playing board and card games with family. She also loved camping, hiking, and many sports (mostly as a spectator!), but especially tennis, golf, football, and basketball.

Linda graduated from Shelly High School, attended Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho, worked as a secretary in the Chemistry Department at the University of Arizona in Tucson, the Education Department at Utah State University in Logan, and The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Salt Lake City.

Linda enjoyed traveling and for over 25 years she, her sister JoAnn, and brother Roger took many vacation trips together. After JoAnn's death, Linda and Roger continued the tradition and took a cruise through the United Kingdom and France, spending a day in Paris. Linda had fond memories of Temple Tours throughout the U.S. and Canada with Roger, her sister Irene and brother-in-law Allan. Upon her retirement she celebrated with a one-month cruise through Chile, around Cape Horn, across the Drake Passage to Antarctica, up to the Falkland Islands, Argentina, Uruguay, and a side trip to Iguazu Falls.

With her niece Becky, she also toured Israel, Jordan (Petra), and Egypt where she cruised down the Nile River, saw the Valley of the Kings, many ancient temples, the Sphinx and Pyramids. The last memorable exotic adventure was with Becky and Roger on a cruise to Cozumel and Belize. Her deepest regret was not having been blessed with children, and her greatest joy was found in many happy moments spent with her beloved parents, brother, four sisters, many nieces and nephews, cherished cousins, and friends.
