She gained patience for herself and others, learned to slow down and relax, and embraced the gift of allowing others to care for her, just as she had always done for them. Without words, Linda could still powerfully convey the deep love she had for her family and friends.

Linda will be deeply missed by her family, friends, and the many lives she touched. She leaves behind a legacy of love, service, and faith that will continue to inspire all who knew her. She is survived by her beloved husband, J. Gordon Engar, their children, grandchildren, siblings, nieces, nephews and countless other family members.
