She could be found in bleachers and stands across the state and beyond, cheering at volleyball games, track meets, soccer matches, basketball games, tennis matches, baseball games, Taekwondo tournaments, and football games. Mom loved spending time in the outdoors, especially here in the Wasatch, where she was always moved by the beauty of this state. Her most-loved trail, Catherine's Pass, winds through her favorites: Indian paintbrush, lupine, and columbine and continues to a stunning field of balsamroot under Lake Mary; and four years ago, at the ripe old age of 80, her family joined her in hiking the Wasatch Crest Trail, a goal she'd made for herself decades earlier. She also cherished the company of her lifelong friends, many of whom, like the Jane Pops (sorry, Mom), she had known since her days at Granite High (Class of 1959). Their laughter, adventures, and shared memories were a joyful constant in her life.

Linda is survived by her adoring husband, Gary Service, to whom she was sealed for time and all eternity in the Logan Temple; her children John (Alison) Service, Chris Service, and Mindy (Justin) Thompson; seven grandchildren; one great-grandchild; and her sister, Pat Stevenson. She was preceded in death by her parents and siblings.
