



## Lonni Dee Glazier Thorpe

*June 27, 1948 ~ February 6, 2023*

After a lifetime defined by a deep commitment to her family, faith, constant learning and quiet, meaningful service, Lonni Glazier Thorpe died on February 6, 2023, in Sandy, Utah after a valiant battle with cancer. Lonni endured her health challenges with grace and positivity, and despite her illness, she always focused on uplifting those around her including family, friends and those impacted by cancer.

Lonni was born on June 27, 1948, in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Harold Don Glazier and Virginia (Peggy) Bello. She was the oldest of five children. Lonni grew up in Holladay, Utah, graduated from Olympus High School and later attended BYU.

On March 26, 1969, Lonni married her eternal companion, A. Lear Thorpe, in the Salt Lake Temple. Lonni and Lear are the proud parents of four children: Brett Lear Thorpe (Laura), Adam John Thorpe (Jeanette), Elizabeth Anne Leese (Jason) and Jeremy Don Thorpe.

As a devoted member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Lonni served in the Relief Society, Young Women and Primary organizations as well as an ordinance worker in the Salt Lake Temple. Her favorite calling was VIP Hosting where she and Lear worked with visitors from around the world, including various religious and secular leaders.

Lonni was a talented writer, a gifted quilter, and an excellent cook. She enjoyed traveling with her family and especially loved playing golf with her husband, children, and grandchildren. She supported her children and grandchildren throughout their educational pursuits as their ultimate motivator and cheerleader. As an incredible friend, she maintained close relationships with special connections made throughout her childhood and adult life. She loved and served those around her and made a positive difference in the lives of those she touched. Lonni's personal motto was "love and lift." She truly exemplified this motto in all she did.

Lonni is survived by her husband Lear, their four children, 11 grandchildren and two great grandsons. She was also looking forward to the birth of two great granddaughters later this year. Lonni is preceded in death by her father, Harold Glazier, and her brother, Michael.
