Larry (Lorence) Allen Harmer, a beloved husband, father, son, brother, and friend, passed away peacefully in his sleep at his home in Holladay, UT, on January 5, 2026, at the age of 54.

Larry was a humble servant born on December 7, 1971, in Saratoga, CA, to Roy Howard and Cora-Beth (Hassell) Harmer. His family moved to Atherton, CA, in 1972 and then to Holladay, UT, in 1978.
