Margene Ludlow Hardy, a cherished wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and sister, peacefully passed away on Sunday, December 8, 2024, surrounded by her loving family.

Margene was born on March 11, 1939, in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Gene Ludlow and Mary Morley Ludlow. As the eldest of three girls, she took great pride in being a big sister to Marsha and Diane. After her parents divorced, she was fortunate to gain a "bonus" father, Jack Rockhill, along with a brother, Bill, and later a sister, Karen, and brother, Jeff. She also had the joy of being reunited with her sister, Susan Farley.

She attended South High School. After high school she worked in the Relief Society Magazine department at the Church Offices, where she served as a secretary to Myrna Hardy. When her kids came to pick up their little ones, the grandchildren often begged to have sleepovers with Grandma. She never turned them down, even after hectic days with numerous kids. Together, they watched movies, played games, and worked on puzzles, with Grandma often joining them to sleep on the floor, making her grandkids the joy of her life.

A member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Margene dedicated much of her service to the Primary. When asked if she would like to serve somewhere else because she was always surrounded by children, her response was always, "There is nowhere else I would rather be."
