It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of our beloved wife and mother, Mary Lynne Bowen. She passed away peacefully on Sunday July 21st, 2024, in Salt Lake City, Utah at the age of 71.

Mary Lynne was born on July 22nd, 1952, in Idaho Falls, Idaho to Frances Denney Harker and John Ray Harker. She was the sixth of eight children born to her parents. Mary Lynne grew up on her father's farm in Shelley, Idaho. She learned to work hard on the farm and recalled moving sprinkler pipe beginning at the age of six. She often said her favorite memory was when her father decided to quit farming. Mary Lynne graduated from Shelley High School and went on to attain an associate's degree in art from Rick's College. She was a talented painter and sculptor, and her family displays her paintings and sculptures in their homes to this day. In the fall of 1972, Mary Lynne attended her senior year at Brigham Young University. She met her sweetheart, Lane Bowen, at a telethon fund raiser for the school. They dated, were engaged by Valentine's Day, and married in the Logan Temple on August 3rd, 1973.

Lane and Mary Lynne's first home was in Taylorsville, Utah. They remember those early years with fondness. There they enjoyed gardening and starting a family. Lane held many positions in the physical therapy field. He eventually climbed the corporate ladder, which led to multiple moves.
