Michael David Godwin Weiss passed away Sunday, February 15, 2026 at the age of 86.

Born on June 18, 1939, he was the first baby delivered on Father's Day at LDS Hospital. Mike, or Mickey as he was known by siblings and childhood friends, was the last of 10 children born to Karl and Therese Anna Baumgaertner Weiss. He served in many callings in the church throughout his life, including as a senior missionary in Danville, Illinois with his beloved wife in the Peoria Illinois / St. Louis Missouri missions.
