Michael J Jensen, 76, of Salt Lake City, Utah, passed away on February 1, 2024. Born on November 13, 1947, in Salt Lake City, he was the son of Marjorie Sutherland Jensen and Floyd B. (Shum) Jensen. Michael attended Highland High School in Salt Lake City and later attended the University of Utah.

Growing up on Hillcrest Avenue in Salt Lake City, Mike was a lifelong member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Outside of his professional life, Mike had a variety of hobbies that brought him joy. He was an avid golfer, runner, and fisherman, and enjoyed playing both baseball and softball.
