Michael Paul Osterloh, 58, of Sandy, Utah, passed away on December 10, 2021. He was surrounded by family in his home, after a courageous battle with brain cancer.

Mike was born to Fred and Gayle on June 7, 1963, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Growing up, he loved sailing his Hobie Cat and skiing in the Wasatch mountains. Mike graduated from Skyline High School. He later studied in Jerusalem through Brigham Young University, where he developed a passion for Middle Eastern history and politics. Mike served a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Helsinki, Finland. He then continued his studies at Brigham Young University where he graduated from the Accounting Program and met his sweetheart, Denice. They were married in the Oakland Temple on November 22, 1986. Mike studied law at the University of San Diego and later received his Master of Laws in taxation at the University of the Pacific in Sacramento, California.
