Coming to Utah around the age of 3, Michael would fall in love with the outdoors soon after. As a kid, Mike was glued to the hip of his father Charles. Everything that was of interest to his dad, Mike would take a fond attachment to as well. This included aviation and an amazing connection to nature that he would then hold onto for the rest of his life. The following years would be filled with normal occurrences including teenage fun and mischief with his 'boys', but never was the sense of love and companionship lost.
