Michael was deeply proud of his military service, but the experiences he endured left deep and lasting scars.

After his time in the Marines, Michael proudly worked in law enforcement and security. He had a strong sense of justice and an instinct to look out for others, even when it was difficult to care for himself.

He shared special bonds with his two German Shepherd dogs, Mauser and Rosie. He will be remembered for his kindness, sense of humor, and the warmth he showed to his closest friends and family.
