Jim is survived by his special daughter, Jennifer (Jenny) Felter and his granddaughter Alexis (Lexi). They have been the light of his life. He also has many friends and relatives that will miss him and his big smile. He was preceded in death by his mother, Ida Lovell Kristiansen and his father Alf T. Kristiansen.
