Fred Ray Hales passed away peacefully on March 17, 2015 in Salt Lake City, UT surrounded by his family. Ed Plum, as he was often known, will long be remembered for his charming wit, quiet manner, and kind ways. Fred made us smile.

Fred was born July 17, 1937 in Delta Utah, the son of Iman and Ferris (Ashman) Hales. He graduated from East High, received his JD from the University of Utah, and was a member of Pi Kappa Alpha. Fred married his angel, Jane Watson, September 12, 1960 in the LDS Salt Lake Temple.

Fred began his career as a systems analyst with IBM in Salt Lake, continuing in Helena, MT, followed by twenty-five years in Endicott, NY.
