She was quite the dancer, she and Joe would dance the night away. One of the memories I have is when they would come home, and we would fix them all breakfast it was about eight of them usually and it was so fun, we loved that growing up.

She was super excited going with what I called "the old farts" (Shorty and Lynn, Shirley and Rick, Kaye and Pete, Bill and Dorene, and Cheryl and John) to dinner all the time. Sometimes us younger ones could go, and we all cherish those times so very much. The laughter and seriousness of those conversations were something we will never forget. She was such a wonderful Grandma, she loved her Grandchildren to the moon and back. She was blessed with many others from my daycare and the Haunted Houses that called her Grandma.

At the beginning of 2021, she had to go to a rehabilitation facility after a fall. This was hard on her and on us. We missed her so very much. We had been a trio for so long. She has been at the Lodge at Riverton for a few months and has made some wonderful new friends. They called her the leader of the pack or Nyla's' posse. We are very grateful to them and how they all cared so much for her. They were all there for us in her last days.
