Rachel Day Patience, passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by her loving family, on Sunday, September 7, 2025. She was 94 years old. Rachel was known as a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She was born on April 1, 1931, in Salt Lake City, Utah, the daughter of Harmon Eastman Day and Phoebe McConnell Day. Rachel also pursued art, taking lessons for many years and creating many beautiful oil paintings. She was proud to serve on the Draper City Arts Council and cherished the friendships she formed there. Rachel had a passion for service and held numerous church callings in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She was deeply devoted to her faith, and always strove to live the Gospel. Rachel was a wonderful example to her family and all that knew her.

Rachel married Joe Patience on September 22, 1950, in the Salt Lake LDS temple. Together they raised six children: Debbie (Jim) Fairbourn, Steve (Pam) Patience, Kathy (Lyle) Nielsen, Tyler (Cherilyn) Patience, Jolene (John) Priddy, Rachelle (Jody) Watts.
