Richard Carl Mhlfeith, our beloved husband, son, brother, uncle, nephew, and friend, peacefully passed away with his loving wife and devoted sister by his side at his home in Salt Lake City, Utah on August 29, 2023 after a lionhearted battle with cancer. Richard was born on April 13, 1976 in Ogden, Utah to Carl Max and Kathryn Ann Moesinger Mhlfeith. He was a delight all his life and a friend to all. Richard moved with his family from Ogden to Salt Lake City when he was four years old. He attended Highland High School, graduating in 1994, and then attended the University of Utah on a full-tuition scholarship where he studied music. Richard was a gifted and dedicated musician. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in music education and then with a master's degree in bass trombone performance. He also obtained a bachelor's degree from the U in biology. He played trombone for several years in the University of Utah Marching Band. Richard was a natural teacher and thoroughly enjoyed teaching private lessons to trombone students. He later returned to school at Weber State University where he earned an RN degree, and then a BSN degree from the University of Utah. Richard was a talented and compassionate nurse and found great joy and deep satisfaction in caring for his patients. He also really enjoyed working with his fellow nurses and considered them great friends.

Richard was adept at so many things. He was industrious and very knowledgeable. He skillfully completed several remodeling projects; beautified his childhood home backyard by constructing large ponds and planting dozens of beautiful trees; and he enjoyed working on his Land Cruiser so that he could take it and those he loved on adventures in Moab, out in the Utah West Desert, or up in the mountains behind Bountiful and Farmington, Utah. Of all of Richard's incredible accomplishments, the one that was the most dear to us, his family, was his ability to love. He cared deeply for his family members and friends and was always quietly and unassumingly finding ways to serve and help them. Richard adored his mother and served her unceasingly until her unexpected passing in 2017. He loved and looked up to his big brother Mike who also passed away unexpectedly in 1985. He loved his niece and nephew and enjoyed taking them on "epic road trips" with his sister, their "Tante" Catherine. He was a totally devoted brother to his two sisters, Catherine and Kimberly, and he loved and helped care for his father, Max. He enjoyed every opportunity to be with his brother Kirk at a sporting event or in the mountains hiking and camping. He had a special bond with his "big sister", Darcy Stallone, and loved her as her devoted "little brother." Richard married his precious eternal companion, Deborah Hatch, on June 18, 2022 in the Provo Utah Temple of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
