Our Papa peacefully passed away at the age of 88 on December 21, 2022. He’s reunited with his sweetheart, Margaret Jutkins, leaving a legacy of generosity, love, and support. He was born on October 14, 1934 to Dwight Leonard Jutkins and Irene Mildred Stone in San Bernardino, CA. He grew up in Challis, ID where he graduated from high school in 1952. He played basketball and was known for his defensive play. He received a basketball scholarship to play at Westminster College in Salt Lake City, UT. He met the love of his life, Margaret Weaver, and many lifelong friends while there. He graduated with a degree in Geology in 1958. Dick and Margie were married at All Saint’s Episcopal Church in Salt Lake City on May 6, 1961. He served as a sergeant in the Army from 1959 to 1962. After he was discharged, he began his career with Mead Packaging, which took the Jutkins family all over the country from Concord and Yorba Linda, CA to Atlanta, GA. He returned to Salt Lake City in the 70’s after accepting a position with the E.F. Mariani Company where he eventually became President/COO and remained until his retirement in 1996. When he wasn’t working, you could find him fishing—the Salmon River in Idaho or Kenai in Alaska were personal favorites—or playing golf. He traveled all over the country playing different courses. One of his hallmark trips was playing in Scotland with his son at The Belfry, Gleneagles, Carnoustie, and St. Andrews. After retirement, Dick and Margie moved to Green Valley, AZ, but Utah and their family called them back in 2004 to be near their grandchildren. They attended innumerable basketball, baseball, track, softball, football, and lacrosse games. He loved doting on his family, especially his wife. He will always be remembered for his steadfastness, intelligence, dedication, and teasing spirit. His favorite saying was, “Do the math.” He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather and will be deeply missed. He is survived by his brother Clifford Jutkins (Shirley), his daughters Kathleen Bates (Lynn Bennett) and Lisa Leatham, his son Richard (Wendi), 12 grandchildren, and numerous great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his wife and parents.
