Richard worked for Garrett/ANR Freightlines for 41 years before retiring and enjoying traveling, camping, and fishing with Sharee.

Rig loved sports, working in his yard, spending time in the mountains with Sharee and most of all, he loved his family. He was truly our family's treasure.

Richard is survived by his children, Richard (Shauna), David, Tom (Rose), Shellie (Ken), daughter-in-law Susan, and sister Shirley. He was preceded in death by his wife Sharee, their son Gordon, granddaughter Andrea, and
